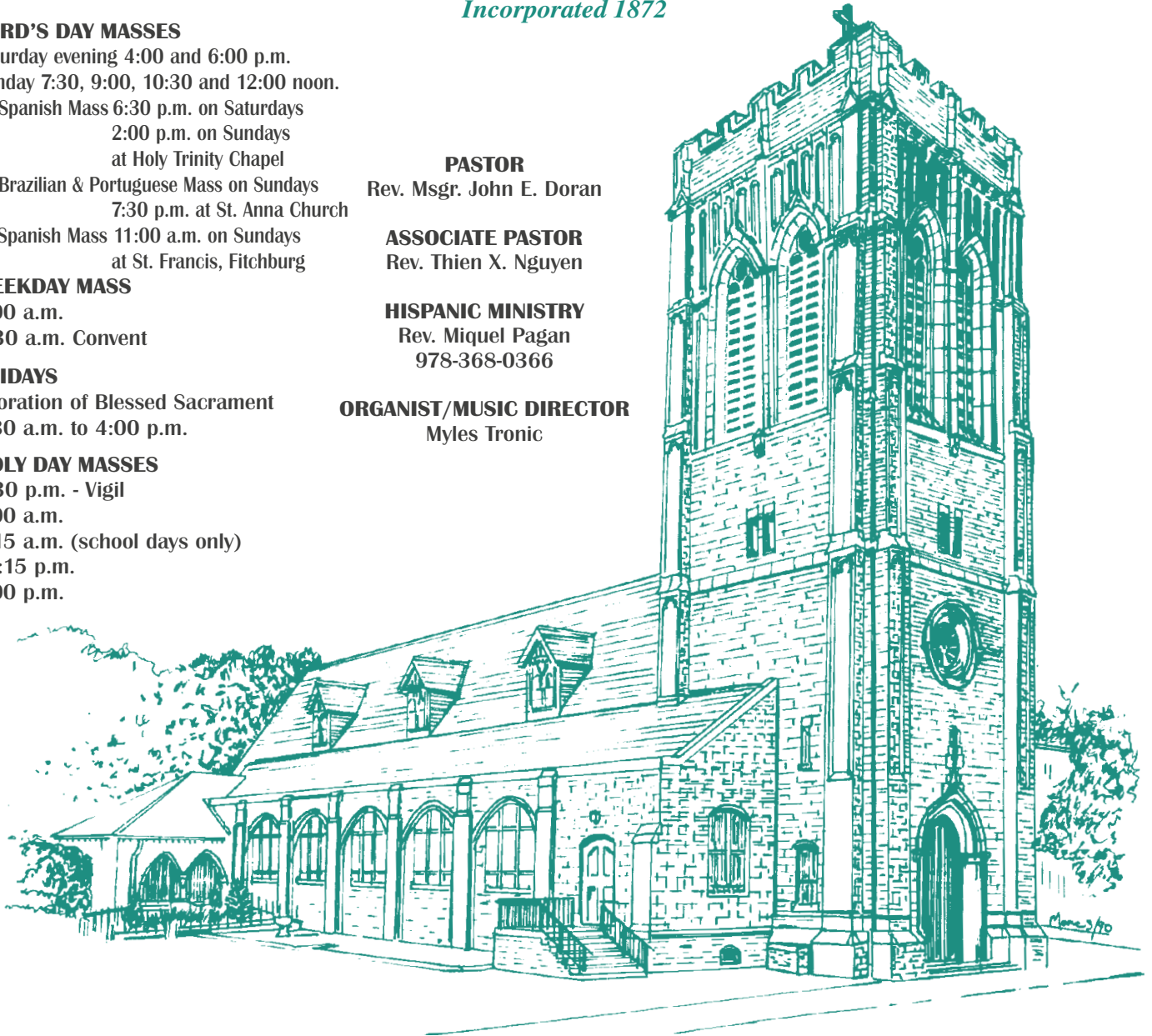

Parish Support

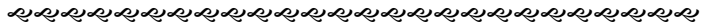
